About the CLE:

Immigration attorneys with Kentucky Refugee Ministries will present a CLE program focusing on immigration relief for vulnerable children. Special Immigrant Juvenile Status (SIJS) is an immigration benefit for children unable to reunite with one, or both, parents due to abuse, abandonment, or neglect.

KRM attorneys will introduce you to this special status, and outline the process for obtaining a predicate order in Family Court for these children. A predicate order is the first, essential step in helping this vulnerable population. Upon completion of this CLE, practitioners can volunteer to accept pro bono referrals for immigrant children in need of counsel to obtain predicate orders.
